2021 FIRE SEASON RESTRICTIONS

Fire Season declared at 01:00 am, June 22, 2021

The Oregon Department of Forestry & Clatsop County Fire Defense Board have adopted the following guidelines to be followed. In Cannon Beach, Fire Restrictions may change. **Currently ...**

PERMITS NEEDED FOR:	PERMITS NOT NEEDED FOR:
Burn Barrels (see #1),	Recreational Beach fires (see #2.)
Open Fires (Debris: Yard, Household, etc.)	Authorized Campsites (see #2.)
Permanent Recreational Fires (see #2.j.)	Outdoor Cooking Fires (in apparatus)

CLOSURE OF ALL OPEN DEBRIS BURNING, EXCEPT:

1. **Burn barrels allowed, Permits Required:** metal barrels in good condition, heavy mesh screens (1/4 mesh or less), available water supply and hand tools required. **Daylight to 10:00 am ONLY**. Permits obtained at Cannon Beach Police Department.
2. **Recreational fires are allowed under the following guidelines:**
 - a. At authorized campsites, personal residence, or beaches.
 - b. No closer than 50 feet from dune grass and 15 feet from any structure.
 - c. No fires allowed in driftwood.
 - d. Clear of all combustibles (brush, grass, etc.) 5 feet around and 10 feet above.
 - e. Maximum fire size is 3 feet in diameter and 2 feet in height.
 - f. Maximum fire pit size is 4 feet in diameter and must be at least 12 inches high.
 - g. Must be attended at all times
 - h. Must be completely extinguished prior to leaving. **(Do not cover fire on beach with sand)**
 - i. May not be allowed during periods of extreme fire conditions (i.e. – high winds, low humidity, extended periods without moisture, etc.).
 - j. **Permits Required** for residential bonfires, permanent recreational fires, e.g. hotels.

CLARITY AND DEFINITIONS

Open Burning. Open burning is defined as fire where any material is burned on the ground or in an open receptacle other than a furnace, incinerator, or other equipment connected to a stack or chimney. Campfires are considered open burning. Campfires are allowed on the beach currently, but not in unauthorized forested areas.

Recreational Burning. Is defined as small recreational fires, such as small bonfires or campfires.

Cooking Fires: Used for residential cooking only in an outdoor cooking apparatus.
